


### **OSHA's Continuing Mission**

- OSHA and its state partners, coupled with efforts of employers, safety & health professionals, unions and advocates, have helped dramatically reduce workplace injuries and illnesses.
- Worker fatalities in America are down on average, from 38 workers a day in 1970 to 14 a day in 2017.
- Worker injuries and illnesses are down from 10.9 incidents per 100 workers in 1972 to 2.8 per 100 in 2017.

- Enforcement



### **Employer Responsibilities**

- Provide a workplace free from serious recognized hazards.
- Train workers in a language and vocabulary they can understand.
- Comply with standards, rules and regulations issued under the OSH Act.



### Worker Rights & Responsibilities

#### Employees have the right to:

- Report unsafe conditions and injuries to management or OSHA
- Assist an OSHA investigation
- Request Training
- Request & Use Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

### File a COMPLAINT

File a complaint if your employer has retaliated against you for exercising your rights as an employee. In states with approved State OSHA Plans, employees may file a complaint under the OSH Act with both the <u>State</u> and <u>Federal OSHA</u>. Under the other federal laws, a complaint must be filed with Federal OSHA directly. You may file a complaint by calling 1-800-321-OSHA (6742), contacting your local OSHA office or filing online here.

### Know Your RIGHTS

OSHA's whistleblower statutes protect you from retaliation. An employer cannot retaliate by taking "adverse action" against workers who report injuries, safety concerns, or other protected activity.

### Worker PROTECTIONS

Since passage of the OSH Act in 1970, Congress has expanded OSHA's whistleblower authority to protect workers from retaliation under twenty-two federal laws. Complaints must be reported to OSHA within set timeframes following the retaliatory action, as prescribed by each law.





- National Safe + Sound Week: August 2020







### Reporting Fatalities and Severe Injuries

- All employers are required to notify OSHA when an employee is killed on the job or suffers a workrelated hospitalization, amputation, or loss of an eye.
- A fatality must be reported within 8 hours.
- An in-patient hospitalization, amputation, or eye loss must be reported within 24 hours.

The element beryllium is a grey metal that is stronger than steel and lighter than aluminum. Its physical properties of great strength-to-weight, high melting point, excellent thermal stability and conductivity, reflectivity, and transparency to X-rays make it an essential material in the aerospace, telecommunications, information technology, defense, medical, and nuclear industries. Beryllium is classified as a strategic and critical material by the U.S. Department of Defense. In 2014, the U.S. produced 270 metric tons of beryllium domestically and imported 68 metric tons, increases from 2013 of 15% and 19%
